Lesson plan Sky how many blues in the sky on opportunity to look at blue colours and concentric patterns

Materials

- PowerPoint on Hundertwasser, Colour wheel selection of blue colours.

What I will do

- Show the Progression plan for the project
- Explanation of how we are going to paint this big picture next panel of lining paper
- Demonstration of using colour pans showing how to get colour onto your brush
- Demonstration how to put colour onto paper
- Demonstration how to use a plate as a palette
- Demonstration making concentric patterns

What the pupils will do

- Children will watch the demonstration of painting making concentric patterns
- Children will watch PowerPoint
- Children to use paints and experiment with harmonious colours (blues to violet) creating a concentric pattern
- At the end of the lesson after break think of an object on the ground flowers in the sky helicopter plane

Children to be introduced to water painting techniques and the words translucent and opaque

Children know the names of three different blues pthalo blue, Prussian blue, indigo
