
### The Virtual DalesRail - guided walks from the Bentham Line 1963

The first Lancashire DalesRail ran in 1976 as a charter service and coupled up with an equivalent service from Leeds. In 1978 Clitheroe station was reopened for DalesRail for a mere £2,000. As is well known to all DalesRailers the service has always been strongly linked to encouraging people to get out into the countryside from Lancashire and to take part in a guided walk. Yet the idea of using rail for guided walks is not new.

Take a look at the handbill sent in by Craig Ward dating from September 1963. This shows an ambitious programme of guided walks starting from Giggleswick, Clapham and Ingleton stations. Yes that's right Ingleton just before it closed in 1964. Just like today's DalesRail it must have been a long day out especially for those coming from Manchester and for rail enthusiasts it travelled over the now closed Colne to Skipton line.

### GIGGLESWICK CLAPHAM and INGLETON

Any person travelling on the Special Excussion may take part in the Organised Rambles but those not accustomed to long walks are asked to refrain from joining the \$TRENUOUS Party. The Rambles are led by Official Guides of the Ramblers' Association (Manchester Area) by the following routes:

A PARTY—Strenuous (16 miles) Book and alight Ingleton
via: Crina Bottom, Ingleborough Hill, Chapel-le-Dale, Whernside,
West Fell to Ingleton.

B1 PARTY—Moderate Strenuous (14 miles) Book to Ingleton alight at Clapham via: Ingleborough Woods, Trowgill, Gaping Gill, Ingleborough Hill, Chapel-le-Dale, Scales Moor to Ingleton.

B2 PARTY—Moderate (12 miles) Book and alight Giggleswick
via: Settle, Sugar Loaf Hill, Victoria Cave, Catrigg Force, Stainforth, returning
along Riverside to Settle and Giggleswick.

B3 PARTY—Moderate (12 miles) Book to Ingleton alight at Giggleswick via: Feizor Austwick, Clapham, Newby to Ingleton.

B4 PARTY—Moderate (12 miles) Book and alight Ingleton
via: Thornton Hall. Mason Gill, Leck Hall, Laithbutts, Burton in Lonsdale,
Coppa Hill, returning to Ingleton via Riverpaths.

C PARTY—Easy (7 miles) Book and alight Ingleton

via: Circular walkaround the beautiful and famous water falls of Ingleton.

#### BOOK IN ADVANCE

The organisers reserve the right to adjust the numbers in the parties to suit the capacity of the catering facilities, etc.

Routes will be altered at the discretion of the leaders to suit the prevailing conditions.

Passengers intending to join one of the parties should carry some food; it is also advisable to have suitable strong footwear and to carry a light waterproof.

Guides and their assistants will give every help and information possible to passengers but no responsibility is undertaken for accidents or loss.

Passengers taking dogs on the rambles are requested to keep them under control.
